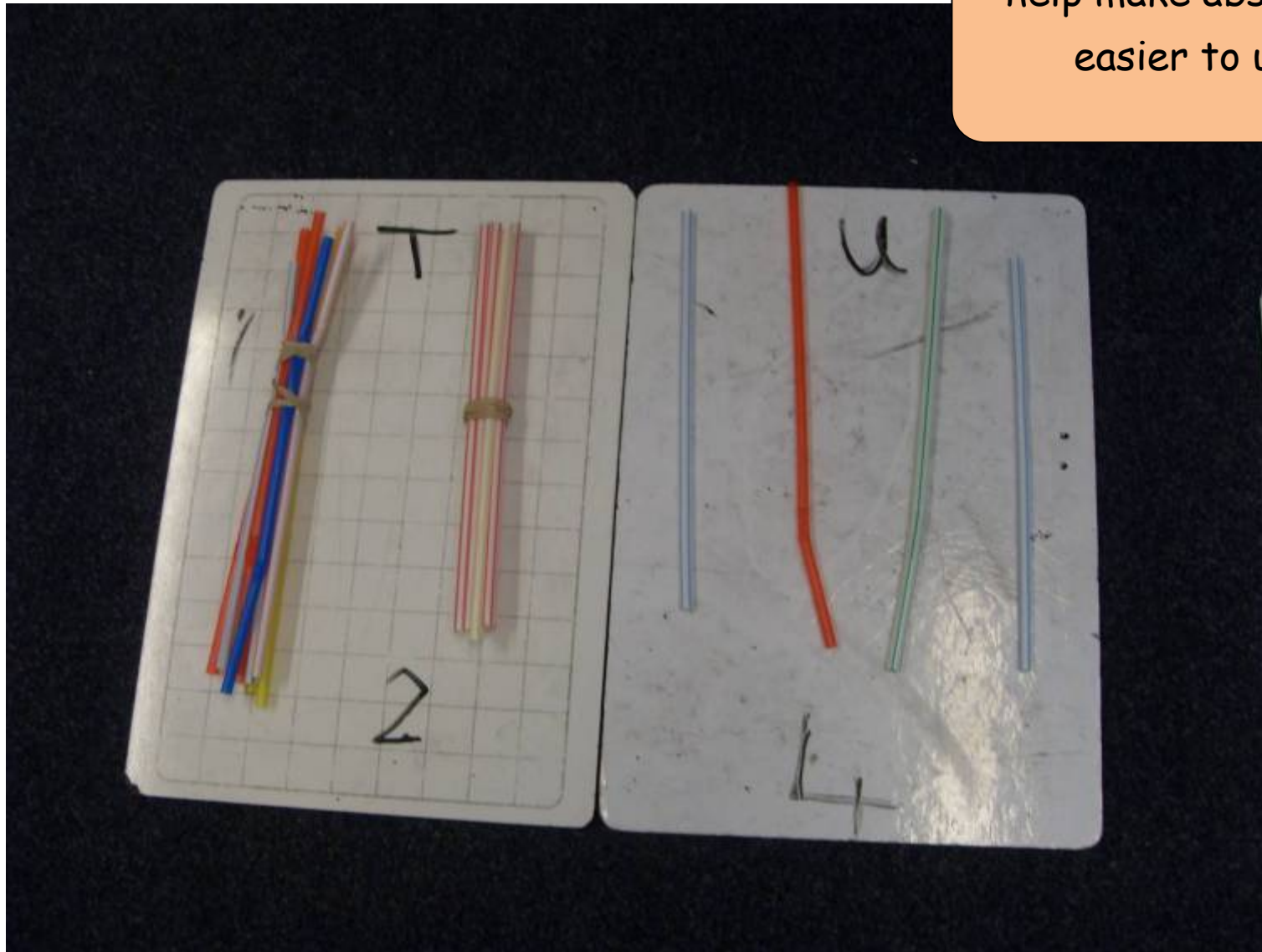




I like using big bits of paper and coloured pens. It makes learning my spellings fun!

I always get my coloured overlay because it stops the words being fuzzy, I can read a lot faster when I use it.


It soothes my headaches and makes reading easier.

SEND Governor leading a whole school assembly on how to understand and support peers with ASD.

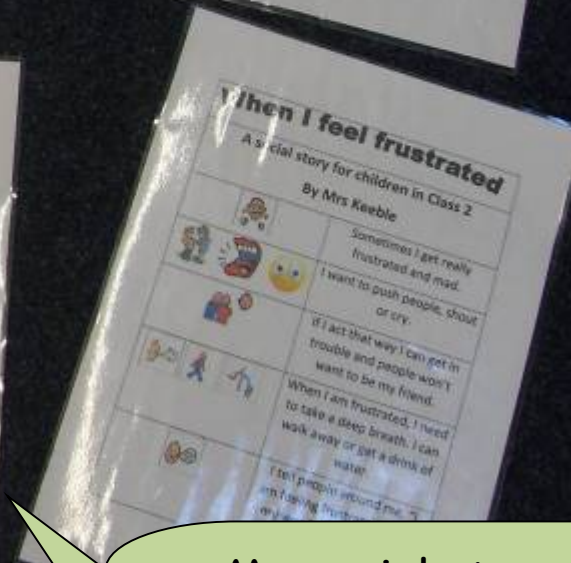
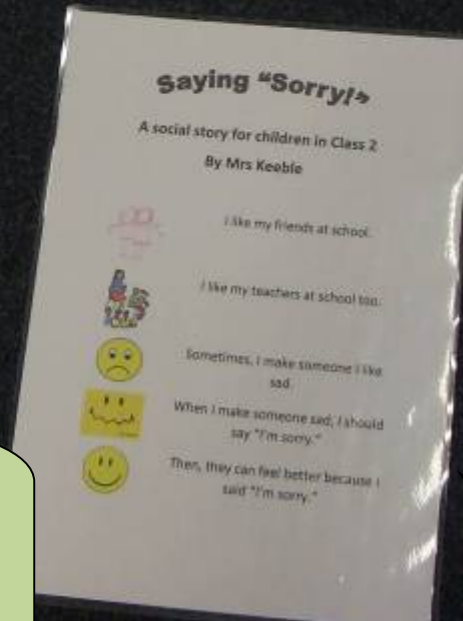
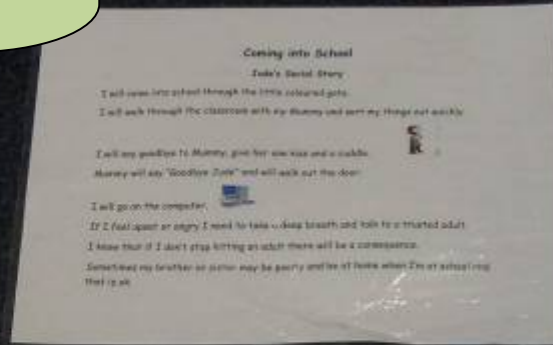
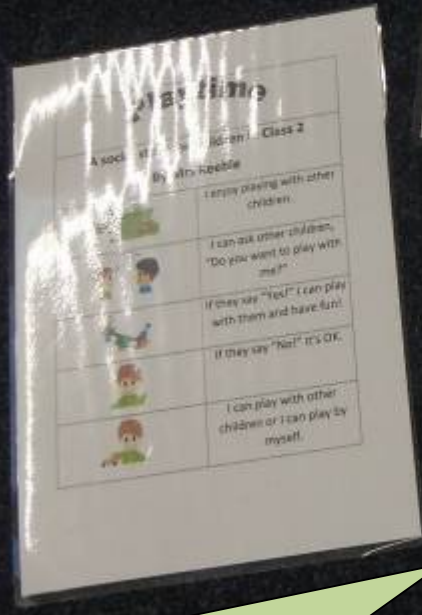
