2021/22 (Year A) – Neptune and Saturn sharing the same topics due to the cohort and restructuring of classes from 4 to 5. If we remain at 5 classes next year, we will review topics accordingly. (Year 3 children will revisit the topics in Year 5)

2022/23 (Year B) – Neptune and Saturn sharing the same topics as 5 classes to continue with a split Year 4 cohort. Knowledge to be learnt in each class to be differentiated to ensure progression as topics are revisited in later years. (Year 3 children will revisit the topics in Year 5).

Seaside topic to be taught in Mars and Venus to ensure that all children in Year 2 have learnt about a local history topic and to ensure a comparable experience for split Year 1 group. Consider if this continues to be taught in multiple classes in KS1 moving forwards.
