They are enabled to develop their physical skills and their personal and social well-being is at the centre of everything we do.

In order to ensure the best possible progress and highest attainment for all pupils, we aim for our curriculum to stimulate and encourage an enjoyment of and commitment to learning. Creativity is at the heart of what we do and our curriculum provides all children with a wide range of experiences including extra-curricular and residential trips, whole school days and exciting visitors. In order to ensure appropriate coverage of all National Curriculum subjects within mixed year group classes, we run a two-year rolling programme for the Foundation Subjects for our Key Stage 1 and 2 classes.
